

ANALYSIS

UAE-MOFAIC remains in the 'Very Poor' category and has dropped over 16 points since the 2020 Index. It sits in last place in this year's Index. UAE-MOFAIC comes in the bottom five organisations across all components of the Index.

UAE-MOFAIC made no data consistently available in any format for finance and budgets, performance, or project attributes. For organisational planning and commitments, UAE-MOFAIC only scored points for accessibility due to having an aid data portal. Only tenders were published for the joining-up development data component.

RECOMMENDATIONS

• The UAE-MOFAIC should start publishing timely, comprehensive, and forward-looking information on its foreign assistance in a comparable and open format by adding an IATI organisational file and data about all of its activities.
